Dr. Shanthie Mariet D'Souza is a scholar, researcher, analyst, writer, editor, consultant, adviser and subject matter expert with specialisation in International Relations (IR) and decade long field experience in Afghanistan and South Asia. She is Associate editor for the Journal of Asian Security and International Affairs, Expert and Contributor to the Middle East-Asia Project (MAP) at the Middle East Institute, Washington D.C., Senior analyst for the South Asia desk with the Wikistrat Analytic Community, and Adviser for Independent Conflict Research and Analysis in London.As Adviser at the Independent Directorate of Local Governance (IDLG), Government of the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan, she has worked on issues of subnational governance and downward accountability.
